

Do your students know about **MATCHED PAIRS**?

Online testing with **PARCC** will most likely include questions which require students to make **MATCHED PAIRS** by **DRAGGING AND DROPPING**.

To correctly answer the question, students need to position their mouse and click to choose the best answer, drag and drop their answer in the space (which may be before or after the option) that best matches. When all responses are in place, the student would then hit a **SUBMIT** button in order to record their answer.

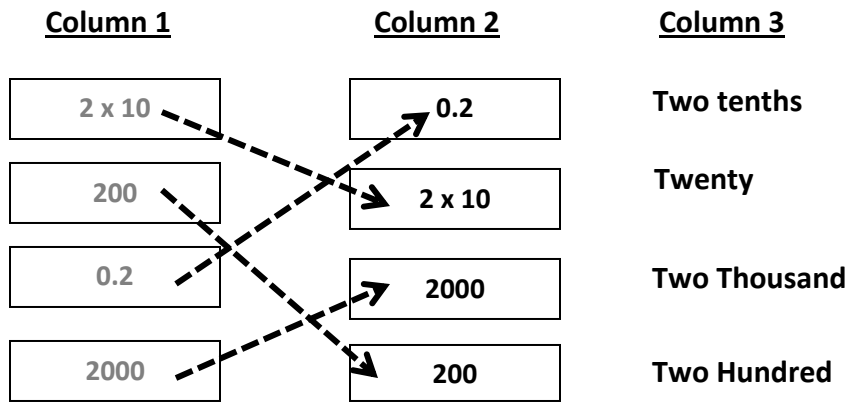
Here is an example of a question which requires **MATCHED PAIRS**.

Directions: Drag the tiles to the correct boxes to complete the pairs. Match the numbers written in different formats correctly.

<u>Column 1</u>	<u>Column 2</u>	<u>Column 3</u>
2 x 10	<input type="text"/>	Two tenths
200	<input type="text"/>	Twenty
0.2	<input type="text"/>	Two Thousand
2000	<input type="text"/>	Two Hundred

The expectation is that the boxes in the Column 1 would be individually clicked, dragged and dropped into the correct location in Column 2 to create a matched pair with the item displayed in Column 3. To correctly answer this question, the student would move the items from column into column two in the following order:
